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AHIMA Statement on ICD-10 Final Rule Announcement

CHICAGO, July 31, 2014 -- The American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) applauds the confirmation by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) of October 1, 2015, as the compliance date for ICD-10-CM/PCS. Now, everyone in the healthcare community has the necessary certainty to move forward with their implementation processes, including testing and training.

As a long-time supporter of ICD-10, AHIMA is pleased that patients and other stakeholders will soon experience the benefits of a modern and robust coding system with greater specificity about diagnoses and procedures.
